A YEAR and two weeks after they took individual and team gold at the World Equestrian Games, Ros Canter and Allstar B returned to top-level competition and won the CCl4*-Lat Ballindenisk.

The British star pair led the dressage with 27.2 and only added 0.4 of a showjumping time-fault to that. Surprisingly, it was Ros' first four-star victory and comes 11 weeks after she gave birth to her daughter, Ziggy.

"It takes time to get going again, and there was some pressure to return this season and get our Olympic qualification," said Ros, who now just needs a result at CCI4*-S to be individually qualified for Tokyo. "We have achieved what we set out to do, which is a relief and gives me the confidence to crack on.

"'Albie's' real strength in the dressage is doing a mistake-free test, which he did again, and we had a lovely time across country."
