I saw him at a clinic and asked if he would ever be for sale as I quite liked him, and Amy said he was for sale,” said Ros. “Fortunately I had two lovely owners, Jo Needler and Kate James, who wanted to come in with me and buy him.

“He’s a bit like a lazy teenage boy, but once he’s going he’s going. I really rate this horse and I enjoy riding him. Next year he’ll carry on at intermediate and do some three-stars.”

Wiltshire-based Canadian rider Rebecca Howard was runner-up with Cameron Crawford’s Dolmen Cooley, gaining their Le Lion seven-year-olds qualification.
